Fame and Money ≠ Happiness + Satisfaction

Ted Talk to Watch: Robert Waldinger



What keeps us happy and healthy as we go through life? If you think it's fame and money, you're not alone – but, according to psychiatrist Robert Waldinger, you're mistaken. As the director of a 75-year-old study on adult development, Waldinger has unprecedented access to data on true happiness and satisfaction. In this talk, he

shares important lessons learned from the study as well as some practical, oldas-the-hills wisdom on how to build a fulfilling, long life.

While this long-term research study has received funding from private foundations, it has been financed largely by grants from NIH, first through the National Institute of Mental Health, and more recently through the National Institute on Aging.

New CLP Report Available in the LMS

The NIH Training Center believes your time is valuable. Here's a new report from the Learning Management System (LMS) to make tracking Continuous Learning Points (CLPs) a breeze.

The report is called the "NIH CLP Transcript Completions Report for the Learner" and tracks both Supervisory and NIH Acquisitions CLPs. You can easily access, modify and obtain the date range to any time frame to fit your needs.

Steps for running the NIH CLP Transcript **Completions Report for Learner:**

- 1. Log in to the LMS (https://ams.hhs.gov).
- 2. Click on "Reports" located on the bottom of the left-hand menu.
- 3. In the Name field, type "NIH CLP%."
- 4. In the results list, under the Actions column, select "Actions" then "Execute."
- 5. In the parameters, enter a date range not to exceed 3 years.
- 6. Click "Generate."
- 7. The results will show your breakdown of NIH Supervisory and NIH Acquisition CLPs.



The NIH Acquisitions CLPs do not automatically transfer to FAITAS.

Formal and Informal Training

A reflection of the NIH community, this year's coordinator roster includes NCATS - designated Presidential Management Fellows, current and former Mid-Level Leadership participants, scientists, business professionals, and analysts. Coordinators work in small trans-NIH teams to develop a management seminar for IC-nominated participants from across the NIH.

As part of the coordinator program onboarding process, Program Manager, Derrick Prather, facilitated a team-building workshop focused on self-awareness and team dynamics. In addition, NIH Training Center Director, Elena Juris reinforced their learning and furthered their understanding of self and others by facilitating a Myers-Briggs Type Indicator (MBTI) workshop. What a way to support team development! Management Seminar coordination provides an opportunity to refresh and enhance skills needed for roles in both administrative and scientific communities. MSS coordination also includes effectively working with others with similar and different perspectives, planning meetings and events, and networking with others outside of your IC.

In January 2018 the MSS will kick off with another series of learning.
