

NIH Training Needs Assessment SUMMARY



The 2024 NIH Training Needs Assessment (TNA) is a biennial survey the NIH Training Center (NIHTC) conducts to collect NIH training data. This year, all Institutes/Centers (ICs) participated including the Office of the Director (OD). One comprehensive response from each IC resulted in 28 responses. These responses were compiled and analyzed to produce this summary.

Key Findings

Classes: How are ICs' employees' training needs being met?

NIHTC **Open** Enrollments – Meeting ICs' training needs "Always" or "Often" **70%**



NIHTC **Closed** Enrollments – Meeting ICs' training needs "Rarely" or "Never" **70%**
